- educational program commitment
- employability skills acquisition
- mental health counseling

Residents are assigned a masters-level clinician  
for treatment and personal problem solving

A psychiatrist is available on-site to evaluate  
and participate in client treatment plans

Brookwood Florida is licensed by the Florida  
Department of Children and Families (DCF) as  
a residential group home

Brookwood Florida is nationally accredited by  
the Council on Accreditation (COA)
